What do you think about our plans for our other projects and activities?: Would like to see more of the non-productive land/residential D zoned land in north-west Ashburton (Allenton) rezoned residential B and C. Would like to see council apply for funds from Government's recent housing package to contribute to infrastructure in that area (especially sewer lines) to encourage development. Septic tanks will not be sustainable/appropriate there in the future. There is a lack of smaller residential sections and the district's population continues to grow. I support a second urban bridge at Chalmers Avenue. I was told previously that West Street was not an option because the existing bridge and the rail bridge would be too close to any new bridge there in the event of a natural disaster. Is this still the case? I believe council has already started buying land in Tinwald for the Chalmers Avenue option, so why not just come out and say it is the actual option, rather than the preferred one. With the increased number of elderly people living in Lochlea/Turton Green area, a footpath and lighting on Allens Road and Racecourse Road would give them another safe walking path. I hope the proposed new domain entrance off Walnut Avenue does not encroach too much on the existing trees and children's cricket/football fields especially after the sudden disappearance of the flying fox, which no-one was held accountable for. After the art gallery/museum building blow-out, council needs to keep a close eye on the civic centre build.
