What do you think about our plans for our other projects and activities?: That, within a year, ADC conduct a Dark Sky Quality Survey [1] at Mount Somers township and Lake Clearwater settlement. Following the survey, by 2023, ADC should adopt a draft Lighting Management Plan, as outlined in the International Dark Sky Reserve Program Guidelines [2]. ADC should immediately include the recommendations of Guidelines for Outdoor Lighting for RASC Dark-Sky Protection Programs [3] in the formal design process for all new council owned lighting installations. ADC should immediately investigate remedial retrofitted shields to street lighting in Mount Somers according to appendix H of the guidelines (Critical Outdoor Lighting Attributes). In particular, ADC should implement the following clause from appendix H in it's street lighting standards: "All luminaires shall have Full Cut-Off or Sharp Cut-Off shielding or better. The industry definition of FCO shielding is for only 10% of the total light the luminaire shall be emitted within the zone between 80-degrees and 90-degrees from nadir. And, zero light shall be emitted above 90-degrees from nadir." [1] <https://www.darksky.org/our->
